




Mythology of the mighty lord










Vested interests of the military-industrial complex



Military "defence" promotes local arms races










Ceasefire's proposals: policy

- Demilitarise the non-military functions of the SANDF
- Develop civil society's capacity for defensive resistance and peacekeeping intervention
- Mothball the SANDF
- Reduce the Defence vote to 0,5% of GDP
- Increase the number of government jobs in human security

Ceasefire's proposals: mothballing the SANDF

- Civil society and political leadership not yet ready for the Costa Rica option
- Train civil society for defensive resistance and peacekeeping intervention
- Convert military land to peaceful use
- Reduce defence spending to 0,5% of GDP

Ceasefire's proposals:

process

- The scope of this Committee is inadequate to deal with radical proposals such as those proposed
- It is therefore proposed that an inclusive, democratic, civil-society-based process be initiated to reconsider South Africa's defence
- In the mean time it is proposed that no further steps be taken that will compromise that process

Ceasefire's proposals: interim measures

No further steps be taken that will compromise the proposed process. In particular:

- expand the scope of the Defence Review Committee;
- no further substantial weapons purchases
- no increases in SANDF staff;
- increase government jobs in human security and retrain SANDF staff for those jobs;
- no increase in budget for 2012-13; reduce budget thereafter to 0,5% of GDP; i.e. R20billion in 2014-15.
