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Report on the third quarter expenditure performance of conditional grants for the 2011/12 financial year.

### 12 April 2012

### 1. Introduction

The report aims to highlight the expenditure performance of provincial conditional grants for the third quarter of the 2011/12.

### 2. Grant Expenditure Performance

Table 1 reflects on the expenditure performance of schedule 5 grants. Schedule 5 grants are allocations transferred by national departments to provinces for specific purposes.

As shown by Table 1 below, the total adjusted conditional grant allocation with respect to schedule 5 grants amount to R37.6 billion after the mid-year adjustments period. By the end of the third quarter, ended the 31 December 2011, R24.6 billion or 65.4 per cent of the adjusted allocation was spent.

Human Settlement Grants at R15.5 billion and Health Grants at R12.7 billion constitute the bulk of schedule 5 grant funding.

Conditional Grants that are showing good expenditure performance by the end of the third quarter include: Gautrain Rapid Rail Link (100.0 per cent), Mass Sport and Recreation Participation Programme Grant (73.3 per cent), National School Nutrition Programme Grant (73.0 per cent) and Devolution of Property Rate Funds Grant (70.4 per cent)

The following grants per sector are showing low rates of expenditure (i.e. below 65.0 per cent) by the end of the third quarter and should be flagged for further interrogation by the Committee:

- · Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries:
  - a) Ilima/Letsema Project Grant (60.9 per cent)
- Arts and Culture:
  - a) Community Library Services (55.6 per cent)
- Basic Education:



- a) Dinaledi Schools Grant (39.2 per cent)
- b) HIV and Aids (Life Skills Education) Grant (60.6 per cent)
- c) Technical Secondary Schools Recapitalisation Grant (43.6 per cent)
- Health
  - a) Comprehensive HIV and Aids Grant (64.0 per cent)
  - b) Hospital Revitalisation Grant (64.6 per cent)
- Public Works
  - a) Social Sector Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) Incentive Grant (54.1 per cent)

### Comment

The Committee should question the relevant sector departments as to what are the factors contributing to the slow expenditure of conditional grants. What kind of support has the national department provided provinces that have difficulties in spending their grant allocation? Furthermore, the sector departments should explain to the Committee their monitoring and evaluation system/process used to verify provincial conditional grant expenditure and non-financial performance indicators.

The Committee should further note that disaster relief allocations with respect to the agriculture, human settlements and transport sectors were made during the national adjustment budget process. However the respective sector departments by the end of the third quarter did not transfer the allocated disaster relief funding to the qualifying provinces, the exception being the Department of Transport. A discrepancy is however noted in the transfer amount of R240.0 million reported by the Department of Transport as transferred to the provinces, whereby only KwaZulu-Natal Province and North West Province have confirmed receipt of their Transport Disaster Management Grant allocations (i.e. an aggregate total of R35.0 million) at the end of the third quarter.

### Comment

The Committee should question the Departments of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, Human Settlements and Transport as to the factors contributing to the delay in disaster relief transfers to provinces. What assistance has been given to provinces regarding business plans for implementing disaster management?
