ROAD ACCIDENT FUND (TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS) BILL (B 22-2012): REQUEST FOR HELP TO ENABLE ME TO MAKE A CONTRIBUTION TO THE HEARINGS PROCESS BY WAY OF SHARING MY PERSONAL EXPERIENCES AS AN OUTCOME OF THE NORTH GAUTENG HIGH COURT ORDER CASE No. 14575/2007, PRETORIA, 26 JULY 2010 SETTLEMENT: RAF CLAIM No. No. 46/513335/03/0.

I refer to your newspaper advert titled 'HAVE YOUR SAY – ROAD ACCIDENT FUND (TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS)' which appeared in my city's local newspaper, Mpumalanga News, of 19 July 2012, page 10.

This serves as a request to, in one way or the other, make a contribution to this particular legal process by sharing my personal experiences as a victim, survivor and ultimately a 'successful' claimant of a third party against the Road Accident Fund.

I am a 45-year old married father of two and a former employee of the Mpumalanga Provincial Government. The accident in question happened on 10 May 2002 wherein I got mentally disturbed because of severe head injuries as I lost consciousness for two weeks. I was, as a consequence thereof, medically boarded in 2004. Please take note that, in the event of me making a contribution to the hearings, over and above the serious head I sustained, I also have epileptic seizures that may cause me to forget things for a given time before a return to my normal mental state or functioning.

Liberal speaking, my contribution should range from the time when an official of the law firm other than the one that finalised the claim made me sign a power of attorney whilst I was mentally blank on my sick bed, through the questionable conduct of the second one and his relationship to or with and influence on the *curator bonis* responsible for my estate created out of the RAF proceeds. I just feel that there could be very many other instances of vested financial interest that affect a whole lot of a section of our less privileged and poor majority. In fact I dare say that, through the co-operation of other government departments and some state organs, an extensive Truth and Reconciliation-like investigative process could uncover huge amounts of money and capital that is due or owed to the ordinary people that is legally

locked away or for the benefit of legal and other professionals or stolen.

I hope and trust that you find the above presentation useful in enabling you to make a decision for me to make a contribution to contribute to the hearings.
