- The Board's sub-committees focused on their key objectives and ensured Agrément South Africa was well governed.



Typical Product Development Cycle












Transformation

- Transformation within the Agency has been addressed.



- The grant funding for the Agency is channeled from the Department of Public Works (DPW) to the CSIR.
- ➤ The funds are ring fenced within the CSIR Built Environment Unit in a separate Competence Area.
- The Agency's transactions are subject to the policies, procedures and governance processes of the CSIR.
- > The Agency is audited as part of the CSIR Built Environment Unit.
- The CSIR has received an unqualified audit report from the office of the Auditor General for the last few years and has been hailed as an example of good financial management.
