
#### Population Pyramids 2001 and 2011

#### % distribution of population by 5yr age group and sex 2011





#### Percentage of people who were resident in their province of birth: Census 2011





### Census result on Income distribution

Census 2011 found that over the past ten years, the average annual household income for all households in South Africa, more than doubled.

It was up to R103 204 from R48 385 recorded in Census 2001.


# This represents an increase of 113,3% in nominal terms

The Consumer Price Index indicates that income should have increased by 77,5% during this period to have stayed in line with inflation


# Adjusted for inflation

African real HI grew 8.42 times faster than white HI over the 10 years

	African households	White households
2011 HI adjusted to 2001 equivalent by dividing it by 1.775 (the inflation factor)	34 148	205 709
Total growth in real HI	51.6%	6.13%
Ratio of growth African to white HI is 8.42 (= 51.6 / 6.13) i.e., African real HI grew 8.42 times faster than white HI over the 10 years	8.42	1.00

# Average household income

By population group



### Observations

- Average household of income of whites is six times higher.
- Whites are twice likely as blacks to be in salaried work.
- On average, it is not far off to assume, 1.5 whites per household is working as opposed to 0.7 blacks per household.
- Only 3.6% of Africans have attained higher education level compared to 36.5% of whites.
- Actually, earnings per person by race has narrowed quite significantly since 2001.


### **Observations**

The income gap between the races is huge - but that the gap is closing.

At this rate, black earnings could catch up with white earnings in four or five decades. Coloured and Indian household income falls between the two, but both will also catch up.


Among those aged 20 years or more





# % in each age category with no schooling/Gi as their highest level of education



### Attendance at an educational institution


Among those aged 5-24 years



# % in each age category with post-Gr 12 qualifications as their highest level of education


