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Government Approach

- **1994 – 2014:**
 - Social, spatial and economic justice in order to reverse poverty and inequality that characterised the majority of South African society
 - Government policies focused on poverty alleviation
 - Focused Equity, Redress and Access
- **2014 – 2030:**
 - Address social, spatial and economic disparities
 - Poverty reduction and social cohesion
 - Focus is on economic growth and developing the requisite capabilities



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National Development Plan

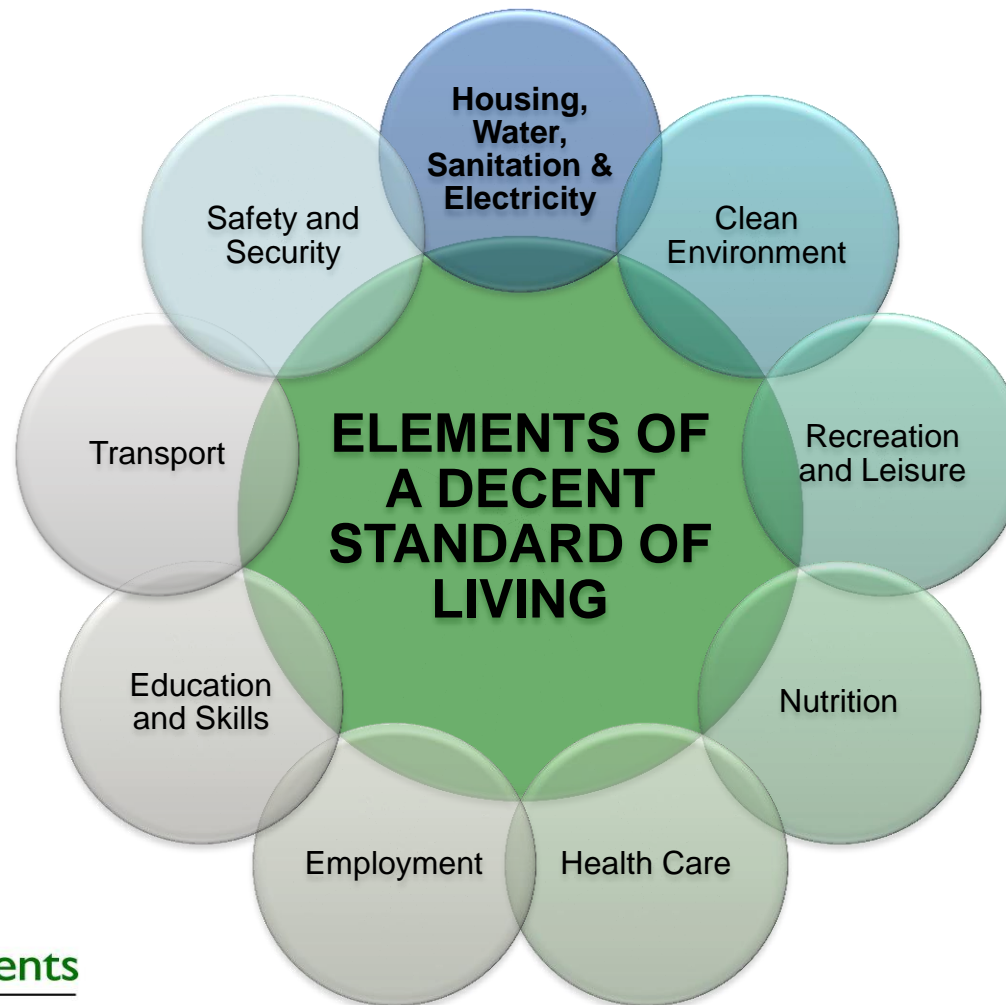
- The plan is a blueprint for eliminating poverty and reducing inequality in the country by 2030, and will provide the strategic framework for detailed government planning going forward
- A need to develop new spatial norms and standards – densifying cities, improving transport, locating jobs where people live, upgrading informal settlements and fixing housing market gaps



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A Call For A Holistic Approach



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Emerging From The Portfolio Committee Jan 2013 Workshop

- Adopt the Comprehensive plan as guiding document for the Green Paper
- Sharpening the tools:
 - What is South Africa's model of sustainable human settlements?
 - What is the role of DHS, PDHS, Municipalities, other government departments in the development of sustainable human settlements?
 - What are sector specific strategies?



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Human Settlements Strategy

- Develop a strategy to address the following:
 - Respond directly to the South African Constitution especially to the provisions in the Bill of Rights that affirm the right of all to a healthy environment; access to adequate housing; and access to basic services (Sections 24, 26 & 27)
 - Reshape apartheid geography
 - Create conditions for humane and environmentally sustainable living and working environments

Complex network design to deliver goods, water, energy, information, etc.

Services

Education, health, culture, welfare, recreation, nutrition, etc.

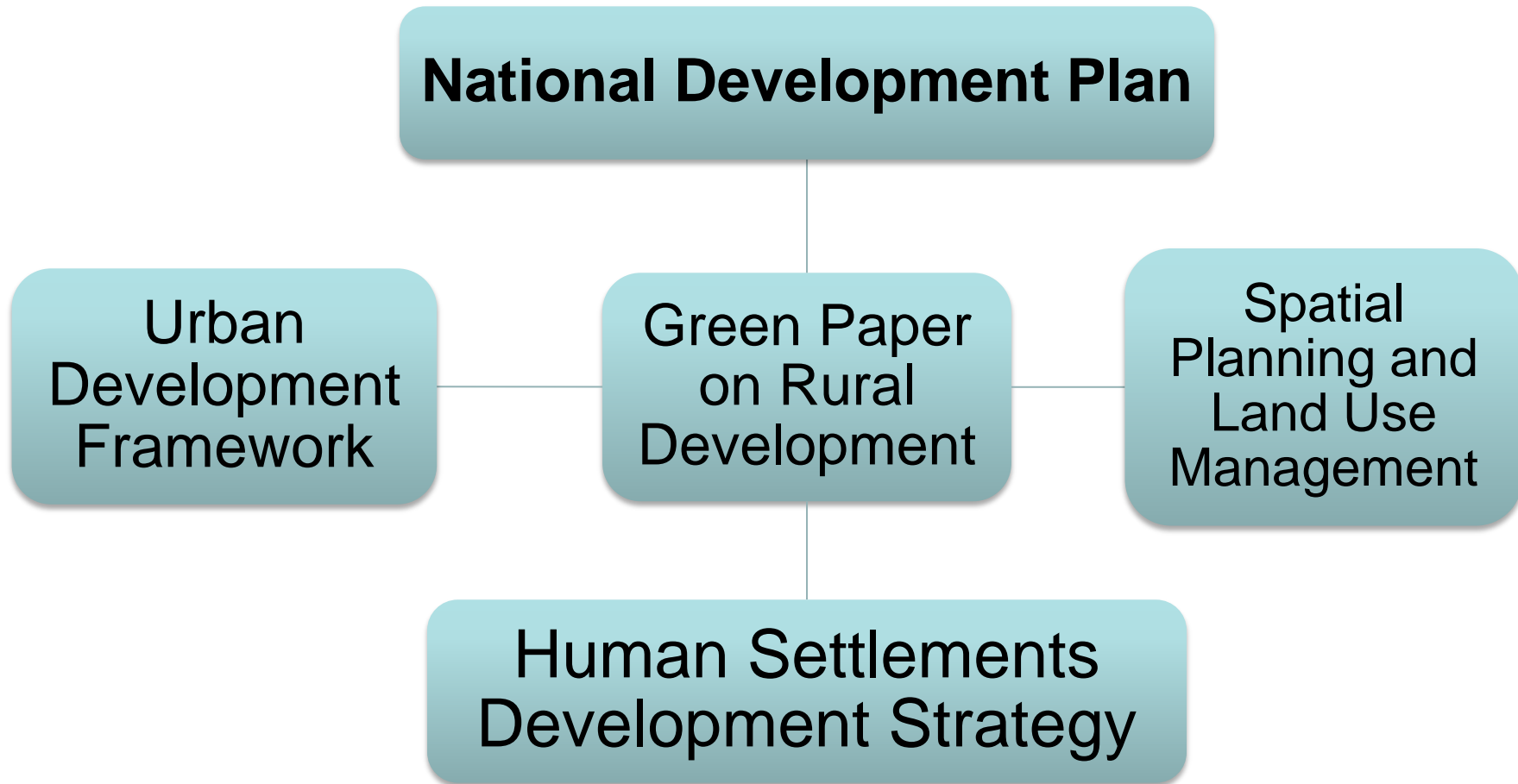

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Where Are We In The Development?

- Conducting self-examination
 - Evaluations focusing on various departmental programmes (e.g. USDG, IRDP& UISP) and assessing the achievement of outcomes (e.g. assets & access) are underway
 - Conducting small scale research
- Appointment of required expertise
- Collaboration with Department of Science and Technology
- Communication and mobilisation of support

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The Development Process

- Define the problem
- Identify the causes
- Evaluate the policy/policies
- Select best solution(s)
- Undertake cost benefit analysis
- Determine socio-political strategies
