There was one network session held for this quarter. The topic for the network session was "Regional and Local economic development (RLED)". The Department is partnering with the Department of Rural Development and Land Reform (DRDLR) and the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) on a new initiative to address rural economic development through a functional region spatial development response. Discussions focused on efforts to engage the private sector on pivotal RLED projects and initiatives and the need to create an active and pro-active partnership network with all relevant stakeholders operating in the LED space so that there is a hollstic approach rather than piecemeal interventions. This session was held on the 28th of August 2012.  4 During the period under review, greater focus was placed on monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of the Local Procurement Accord and the other four social accords. This entailed collating information and compiling progress reports for briefings to the Minister, Cabinet, parliament and its committees.  A meeting was held with the ILO on 4th July 2012 to fashion collaboration on capacity building for social partners. The meeting was aimed at establishing a more sustainable partnership agreement with the ILO on programmes related to support for labour policies, social and solidarity economies and enterprise development.  The EDD met with the Executive Director of the Manufacturing Circle on 29th July to gauge implementation and assess progress on the local procurement accord.  The Department participated at the Industrial Policy in Africa seminar on 4th July hosted by the EDD, UNIDO, the International Economic Association, and the University of Johannesburg among others.
